As we approach the end of the school year, I want to take a moment to reflect on the past year and express my gratitude for your continued support and involvement in our school community.

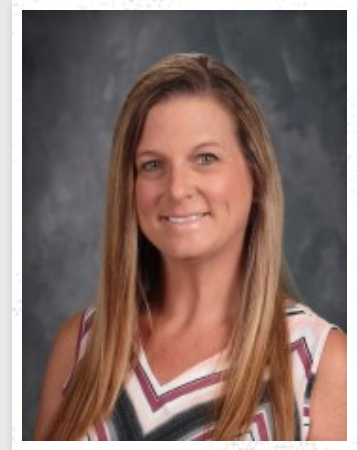

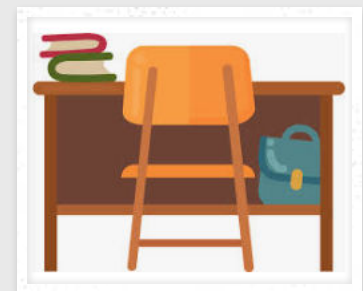
Counselor's Desk
